

Who funds the scholarship program?

Scholarships for engineering students are made possible through the generous contributions of NHSPE members, donor Corporations, and fundraising activities. The intent of the scholarship is to encourage growth and career development at the state level within the areas of Civil, Structural, Mechanical, Electrical, Chemical, and other engineering disciplines.

Who is Eligible for the Scholarships?

Scholarships are granted to high school seniors or college undergraduate students who are currently or will be enrolled in an Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET) accredited engineering program. High school applicants must be in-state (NH) residents and preference will be given to college students planning to attend a New Hampshire university or college. Scholarships are awarded based on financial need, academic achievement, and general community involvement.
